



Summer 2018 Internships and Language Immersions

Bush School students are interning or studying language in 23 countries outside of the U.S. including: Germany, Jordan, France, Wales, Latvia, China, United Arab Emirates, Colombia, Russia, Japan, Austria, Kenya, Lebanon, Honduras, Canada, Belgium, Egypt, Guatemala, Uganda, Puerto Rico, Ireland, Ecuador, and Kurdistan.

For the International Affairs (INTA) Department, the organizations hosting the most interns are: The U.S. Department of State (5 students) and U.S. Pacific Command (3 students). The languages being studied in the greatest amount are: Russian (6 students), Spanish (5 students), Arabic (5 students), German (4 students), and French (4 students).
